

New Trail Proposed Many riders may be familiar with the portion of trail that runs from a big maple tree on C7B west towards Schoharie. This is a trail that is not funded or maintained by any club. Frontier Sno Riders have a chance to bring this trail into the Club's network. All that is needed is for members to get out and talk to the landowners. The Club needs permission for the use of the land. Signed landowner agreements allow for the trail to be covered by the State's insurance program. Plus the Club will sign and maintain the trail to help ensure a safe ride for everyone.

Currently the trail is in 'outlaw' status, meaning the trail has no insurance protection and snowmobilers who use it risk being ticketed for tresspassing. There are bridges that need maintenance, and general brushing of the trail. Signing will be required as well.

About half way to Schoharie there is a trail that turns north toward Esperance/Delanson. This is also an 'outlaw' trail. The trail runs up to Sheldon Road and

passes under Interstate 88. From there it disappears.

Last year National Grid cleared brush and small trees from around the powerlines near Youngs and Gage roads. The crews left an access trail along the powerline, just about perfect for a snowmobile trail. This cleared trail would link up nicely with the current powerline trail that runs towards Delanson. Again landowner permission would be required for

this trail to come into existance.

A plus for National Grid is further coverage of the Trail Watch program along their powerlines. If you own property or live near this trail, please contact the Club if you wish to see this trail become part

of the Frontier Sno Rider trail system.

There are many landowners along this new trail. We need everyone of them to sign on or the trail will be difficult to support. Be sure to tell the landowners all the positives that come from changing an 'outlaw' trail into a club trail.
