Take A Friend Snowmobiling

Many people would like to try riding a snowmobile. They just do not know how to go about it. You can help make it easy for them to try snowmobiling.

If you own two or more snowmobiles, you could offer one for use. There are businesses that rent snowmobiles. There are options and you can help your friend get started in the sport.

Winter time for many people is looked upon as something to endure. Finding fun activities can be difficult. Snowmobilers have a much different perspective on the cold time of the year. They look forward to this fun sport.



We are the best ambassadors for

our sport. Be sure you make a good impression when escorting your friend on his/her first ride. Keep the experience fun, you are their guide and mentor.

Show them the proper equipment to use and make sure they know how it works. Remember your friends may not have any experience with operating power sports vehicles. They may think there is very little to know about riding.

Go over how a snowmobile operates, be specific and blunt. Tell them the dangers that could happen while riding. Let your friends know what to expect when controlling the snowmobile.

Take everything very slow. Let them get comfortable on the snowmobile. Do not blast off and leave your friends behind. Showing off for them will turn them off to the sport.


Club News

Trail Log

Burtonsville - Trail C7F will open as soon as there is snow. Please follow all signs as trail has been rerouted in some spots. Work is on going with the DEC to make the ride even better through the state forest.

Mariaville - The large mud hole is still on the trail C7B in the state forest. A work around has been put in place so you can get by the mud hole.

Esperance - Trail C7F, a non-funded section of trail leading west from the Frontier area, has been closed off by a new landowner. Work is underway to find a new route around this property. Stay off the closed property.

Delanson - Trails in good shape, except for lack of snow.

Duanesburg - Trail C7B is open and running! Please follow signs to keep you on rerouted trail. Stay off all railroad property. The railroad police are patrolling the area and will enforce the law. Please use caution at all highway crossings.

Knox - Trails in good shape, grooming has been going strong when snow conditions permit. Trail to Partridge Run is closed on Middleburgh end due to road issue.

East Berne - Trails in good shape, except for lack of snow. Many people out riding C7B in this area. Work is also progressing on trail to Thacher Park.

Make your ride short the first time out. Pick a trail that is easy to negotiate and free of hazards. Your job is to make this a fun ride, something your friend will want to repeat.

When you arrive back home, be sure to talk about the ride with your new snowmobiler. Hopefully they will have much to say about the ride. Give them a lot of positive feedback, things they did right while riding. Try not to dwell on what they may have down wrong. If you saw them do something unsafe, tell them and explain the proper way to do it.

Keep it fun. The bottom line is that is why we are snowmobiling.

NYSSA: LAWSUIT THREATENS TRAIL SAFETY

January 15, 2009, Long Lake, NY — The New York State Snowmobile Association (NYSSA) is raising an alarm about the recent lawsuit brought by an environmental group against the Adirondack Park Agency (APA) and two other state agencies over the adoption of state trail maintenance and safety standards for snowmobiling in the Adirondack Park.

NYSSA Executive Director Dave Perkins is urging the APA, the state Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) to vigorously defend their actions to ensure that snowmobile trails are the safest they can be. "The new rules reflect the vast experience and knowledge of snowmobile trail maintenance that NYSSA shared with state decision makers throughout the multi-year development process," Perkins said. "We have demonstrated that unsafe trail conditions can be mitigated without undue impact on the forest's natural character."

The Snowmobile Trail Siting, Construction, and Maintenance Guidelines were adopted at the November 2009 APA meeting, allowing for the consideration and implementation of stalled Unit Management Plans (UMP)—plans that identify opportunities for recreational uses and consider the ability of the resources and ecosystems to accommodate such activity.

NYSSA fears that the lawsuit brought by the Adirondack Council may again put these plans on hold.
