An example of how a snowmobile trail crosses many properties. (not an actual trail shown)



do not ride alone.


ride within the speed limit.

El Nino Roars

While every media outlet seems to soundly pull the plug on this season's winter, many snowmobilers hold on to hope for cold and snow.

What else are we to do when faced with the fact that a strong El Nino is trying to influence our weather? Snowmobilers will seek out forecasts that give some chance of a descent winter. The Farmer's Almanac is calling for snow and cold, more than average. Another forecaster tracks Siberian snowfall in October to predict our winter here in the northeast. Far to the southern polar region we find that summer ice extent is the largest on record.

The Enso Index which measures the El Nino strength indicates this winter might look a lot like the 1972-73 winter. Take note that the 2 winters previous, 1970-71 and 1971-72 were very cold and snowy, not unlike 2013-14 and 2014-15! This could be a repeat pattern.

Looking back at 1972-73 and the strongest El Nino year, 1997-98, the northeastern coastal cities had many storms, only it was too warm for snow. Frontier land faired better with above average snowfall but multiple thaws as well.

There are many factors shaping our winter, we can only hope that enough cold and snow falls to provide great riding.






