



Recap and No Flap

Amazing members make an amazing club. With a devoted effort the club thrives even in trying times.

Record low snowfall prevented the Club's trails from opening even once. All of the major snow storms missed our area.

The off-season or pre-season however was highly successful. Many miles of corridor trail were widened to class A standards. This alone is huge as it allows the Club's larger class A groomers to reach sections of trail not possible before. Not only was trail width improved upon but many bridges were upgraded to handle the heavy groomers.

A new section of trail was added in Duanesburg to help keep snowmobiles off the airport. It required a large bridge to be built and reopening an old trail through the woods on the south side of the runway.

Had there been enough snow, we could have ridden on a new section in Esperance which takes the trail behind the Hannaford store and off a large portion of US 20 roadside riding. Major trail improvements were made on S-72 to Thacher Park. S-72 is set to be groomed by a class A groomer. There are plans for future work to eliminate the multiple crossings of Rt 443.

A big change in trail size occurred on C7E from Acorn Drive down through the woods to the rail-road crossing by the YMCA. Along with the trail widening, a brand new bridge was built over the Normanskill.

Over in Duanesburg the heavy duty bridge on C7B was completely replaced with materials supplied by the landowner.

In the town of Wright, major work was done to open up a tight section of woods and grade two hillsides to make the trail safer.

Multiple areas had requests by landowners to reroute trail around crop plantings and noise





sensitive sites. This work required either cutting open new trail or roping off large sections to control riders.

Much of this work was helped by the use of heavy equipment, donated by club members. Makes you really think, without members like this, the trails would suffer.

Local businesses have really stepped up to help the Club with the donation of materials, such as fence gates and tractor trailer frames (for heavy duty bridges). Other businesses donate food at club events and safety classes. Please give your business to the advertisers in the newsletter, they support snowmobiling in vour area.

Club membership remains strong even if not at the record highs of the last couple of years. That says a lot about our club. People know a good thing when they see it and want to be part of it. By renewing your membership before there is snow shows you have a keen interest in supporting your sport.

Here's hoping we have a lot of snow next season to make up for the lack of it this year.

APA Approves Recommendations To Amend The Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan

Amendments increase public recreational opportunities and maintain natural resource protection

Ray Brook, NY - At its March 2016 Board meeting, the New York State Adirondack Park Agency (APA or Agency) approved recommendations to amend the Adirondack Park State Land Master Plan (APSLMP). This historic action marks the first major revision to the APSLMP in nearly two decades. The Master Plan quides the classification and management of State lands inside the Adirondack Park. The APA will now

prepare to forward the recommendations to Governor

Andrew Cuomo for final approval.


