Club Ride In Works

An annual Frontier Sno Riders event is the Club Ride. It is a chance for club members and friends to join together on an adventure filled journey.

Actually having the ride is very special, as it quite often gets cancelled due to no or low snow conditions. The ride is kept very simple, meet at a pre-determined start point, then ride as a group to a destination. At the finish the Club may host a gathering at one of the restaurants on the trail.

This year the club board of Directors and Trustees have not set a date for the ride. Instead the plan is to wait until conditions are favorable. Then get the word out to club members as quickly as possible. In the past start times for the ride are usually mid morning, 9 to 11am. After a mass departure, the group will follow a leader on snowmobile. The route may pass

Depending on time, there may be a planned stop at another restaurant along the route.

The ride will terminate generally around 2 to 3pm. The post ride gathering may go on for a couple of hours. Riders will then leave at their own discretion and return to their respective starting points.

This will make for a full day of activity, so plan accordingly.

Stevie Fronk and Trail Boss Skip Murrell patched up the Rt 146 bridge railings and deck on C7B. Both sides were completely down and ripped away, the groomer blade had pushed them over in two different directions. An inspection this summer should let us know how much work will be needed to bring this bridge back to perfect condition. Pushing the railings out another foot or so will help. This bridge will need funding and labor this summer to get it completed.

Saturday Sheldon Ogsbury, Stevie, Russ and Skip did a little more work on the local Schoharie trail bridge. It is now crossable, but extremely rustic and crude. 6-8" gaps between deck boards and limb wood used to create a ramp onto the bridge.

Tom Rulison and Laudy Hoyenga spent 9 hrs on trail C7E up in Charleston. Felt like they had to reblaze the whole trail with so many trees down and wild grape vines tangled-with brush clogging trails. They put many signs up, used steel construction form post to get holes into ground.

Good news from NBT – our credit card application on behalf of the merits of the club has been approved and the cards have arrived.

Scott Claus and Yancey Zimmer are assuming the responsibility of trail boss for the north western section of our trail system in Burtonsville and Montgomery County where John Scrima has covered in the past. Trail Marshal says...

Beware Outlaw Riders.
Unregistered snowmobiles are a drain on the trail system. There is very little positive these sleds offer.
Area food and fuel businesses will see a gain.
This however is offset by the loss all registered sleds will experience because of the outlaws.
Every registered sled





contributes to the maintenance and grooming of the trails. Club memberships go toward the trails as well. If a rider does not register his/her sled they will not likely join the club either. Insurance on an unregistered sled? Who knows, but in keeping with breaking the law, most likely not.

Whenever an unregistered sled races down the trail, they are stealing a ride. It is a ride that costs everyone, due to trail funds that won't come back to the club in the form of grants. This means less fuel for the groomers, less grooming, less smooth trails, less smiles, etc.

Unregistered sleds should only be ridden on the riders own property. Law enforcement conducts random patrols on Frontier trails. Cleaning up the outlaws is a high priority.


