




Trails Beckon Locally

Northern Area

Burtonsville/Charleston C7E - Scott Claus/Yancey Zimmer - Class A bridge needed in the state forest, contact with new forester has been made. Drifting around pond near Hughes Rd causing concern.

Mariaville C7B - Mark VanWoeart - Brush hogging has been on going. C7B culvert work needed. Trail widening to be completed with heavy equipment. Bob Frost may be able to help.

Sloansville C7F - Laudy Hoyenga - Replaced washed out bridge on C7F. Working on another one.

Central Area

Esperance/Delanson C7E - Tom Rulison - C7E needs reroute behind Esperance Auto/ball field. About a 1/2 mile of trail to be cut open. Big job, lots of help needed.

Duanesburg C7B - Dominick Friello - Mott Rd bridge to be replaced. Old bridge no longer safe to cross.

Wright C7B - Joel Church - Watch for a new pond that was built next to C7B near Benninger Rd. Be sure to stay on trail, do not ride on to pond.

Southern Area

Township S70 - Skip Murrell - Nature Conservatory may restrict use of brush hog on trail. Work may have to be completed by hand.

Knox C7B - Orvil Bates - Ball field bridge needs review, possible site for tractor trailer frame. Trail may be routed off Turner Rd, stay posted!

Maple Inn S73 - Donnie Bauer -

East Berne C7B/S72 - Brian Buchardt - Pat Stemple has been brush hogging trail. S72 moved to go around Dollar General store. Installed gate at new hedge row cut. Replaced culvert for landowner. Karl and Gerry helped out on this project.

Pisten Bully Service School Review

In early September Skip Murrell and myself had the opportunity to attend the Kassbohrer Pisten Bully service school at Mohawk Industrial Werks new state-of-the-art 16,000 sq. ft. facility located in Queensbury.

Over 60 individuals from the snow grooming industry attended the training from NY, PA, CT, WV, TN, NC and even GA – consisting of operators and mechanics from ski areas as well as snowmobiling clubs/entities.

The course was administered by Rod Elwell, North American Service Manager from the US headquarters in Reno, NV as well as local service staff – which covered the latest in hydraulic and electrical systems, various power plants as well as onboard electronics. Troubleshooting, service techniques and maintenance were included.

The information covered and the service tips provided in the seminar should be very helpful in the future as our club currently operates and maintains two Pisten Bully groomers in our fleet.




