Meet Our Fleet


Grooming equipment showcased through the years

by President Gerry Lenseth For those of you that may not be aware, the Frontier Sno-Riders has grown from our origins in the late 90's and with that our fleet of grooming equipment has as well. Here is an overview of our equipment history to date...



2013 Ski-Doo Skandic 600 **ETEC**

In the early years our trails were narrow and our club owned groomers consisting solely of Ski-Doo Skandic snowmobiles pulling 4'x8' mogul master type drags to cover our trail system. In a couple of areas our trail bosses utilized their own snowmobiles with homemade drags as well. Over the years a few of these sleds have been updated with newer models and our current fleet consists of a 2003, 2006. 2008, 2013 and two 2018 Skandics



that can be found working throughout our trail system.

As our membership grew and the traffic on the corridor trails increased we took the leap in 2009 to purchase our first Class A groomer from the Town of Long Lake – a used 2004 New Holland TC45 Suretrac tractor with skidsteer drag equipped with trip plates. This machine was primarily utilized in Albany and Schoharie counties where the trails required extensive widening with larger, stronger bridges built to accommodate the heavier groomer and qualify for Class A trail funding.

In 2014 we purchased a very used and dated 1976 Bombardier Skidozer 252 along with a 7'x12'4"

heavy duty drag to primarily groom a portion of the secondary and corridor trails in Albany county. This machine had its operational challenges over the vears and required constant maintenance attention. This Continued on page 3

Northern Area

Burtonsville/Charleston C7E - Yancey Zimmer -

Mariaville C7B - Mark VanWoeart - Some trail signs have gone up in Mariaville. After hunting season trails will be checked for any downed trees.

Sloansville C7F - Laudy Hoyenga/Brian Schoenherr - This fall has been so wet, limiting trail work. Brush hogging on hold as can't get through with tractor. Laudy reports, despite being sick most of the month, trails over here will be done by Sat.

Central Area

Esperance/Delanson C7E - Tom Rulison - New landowners on C7E at Chadwick and Schoharie Tpk may be willing to work with club. Lots of tree work completed.

Duanesburg C7B/S70 - Open - Cattle pass section widened to 10'. Ash property widened as well. Scott's property will need widening.

With the effort of many to secure

our first significant "Recreational Trail Program" grant, in 2014 we sold the New Holland and upgraded to a used 200+ hp 2000 Pisten Bully 100 trail groomer with a new 8'4"x16'7" heavy duty drag. This machine is the largest in our fleet currently and now has the responsibility to groom from the C7B/C7E junction in Schenectady county to the Thacher Park entrance of S72 in Albany county.

The following year in 2015 we had the opportunity to purchase a rare 1989 Pisten Bully 070

complete with a 2014 14K PJ equipment trailer. A light drag was fabricated in house and this machine operates to this day solely by our equipment/trail boss grooming our corridor trails

from Esperance through Delanson and Duanesburg.

One of our trail bosses in the Montgomery/Schoharie county area began testing the use of a

personal side by side UTV equipped with tracks and a custom drag some years ago. Like all machines, limitations

were learned and this equipment was sold and replaced by a modified Jeep Wrangler with tracks with a larger custom built drag. This groomer is personally owned by our trail boss – but generously designed and operated for the benefit of the club.



2011 John Deere 825i Gator

More recently our trail boss in the northern zone of Schenectady county put to test a 2011 John Deere 825i Gator with tracks and homemade drag purchased used by

the club last season.

Determining that the utilitarian UTV provided better results than others tested in the past, our club had the opportunity to acquire a lightly used 2012 JD 825i Gator to add to our fleet for this upcoming season. Two new custom 6'6"x10' drags with trip plates are currently being built in house by one of our talented trail bosses for these machines. Both of these will be primarily utilized on trails in Schenectady county.

Look for our groomers on the trails and give a thumbs up for their effort and those maintaining the machines and building the drags.

2013 Skandic should only be operated in low range when grooming. Skip M. has added a switch to select the cooling fan to run when needed. This should help with overheating issues on the 2013.

PB100 will have the annual maintenance and track work completed this month.

Two drags are currently being built by Laudy H. for the JD 725i groomers. Metal material quote to be provided. Size should be 6'x9'.

3 brand new kiosks are going out on the trail this season. All will need new trail maps installed. One kiosk to be positioned at S72/C7B junction in East Berne.

Michael Riek has supplied reflective tape for the drags and sign posts where needed.

Cost of signage has gone up like most everything. Please do not run over sign posts.


The two club trailers are up for 5 year registration renewal.


